COVID-19 TESTING: In partnership with [Wake County](#), the North Carolina Community Health Center Association ([NCCCHA](#)), and the NCDHHS, Advance Community Health continues to conduct mass COVID-19 testing to serve our most vulnerable communities. We will conduct testing for pre-registered and non-registered individuals. Current turnaround time for results are 24-48 hours through an online portal. All tests are FREE regardless of ability to pay, but an insurance card is required if the patient has insurance (the patient will not be charged a co-pay).
